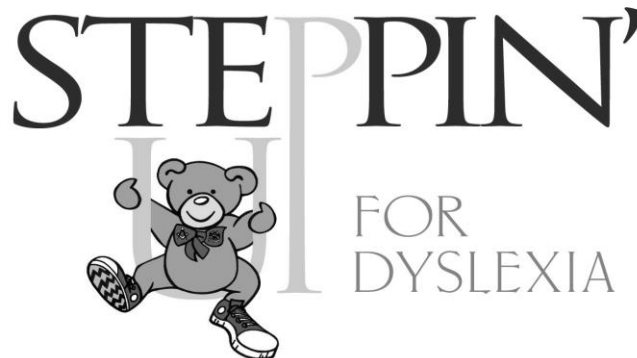

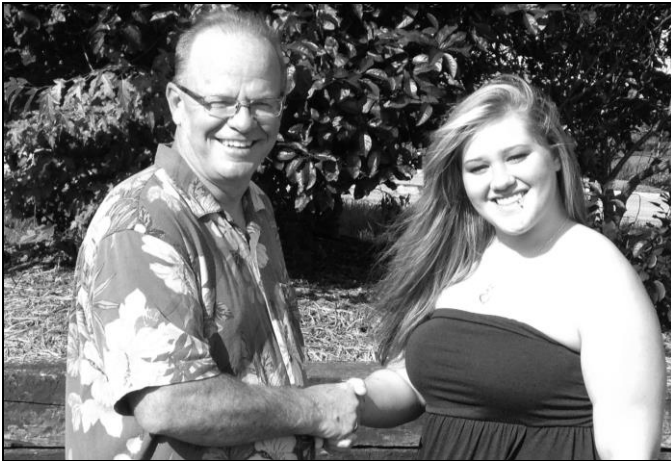

FOUR CHILDREN OF AREA SCOTTISH RITE MEMBERS RECEIVE ABBOTT SCHOLARSHIPS TO HELP WITH COLLEGE EDUCATION

Masonry has never judged men by the bulk of his wallet nor the length of his title, but rather by merit. The same holds true of the Abbot Scholarships. The Abbott Scholarships of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction are more important today in Wisconsin than they have ever been. In the past forty years there has been a tremendous shift in the funding of public college education in Wisconsin. Forty years ago public college education was funded almost 70% by the public for Wisconsin residents so that those with ability, not just those with the ability to pay, could advance through higher education. Today in Wisconsin those colleges with the "Wisconsin" name on them are funded only about 25% by the public for Wisconsin residents, thus slamming shut the door to many with ability but not the ability to pay. It is through the Abbott Scholarship the Rite hopes to help open wide the door of opportunity to the children of some our members. Shown here are four of those children. Congratulations to them. 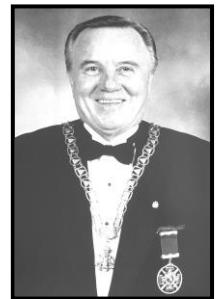

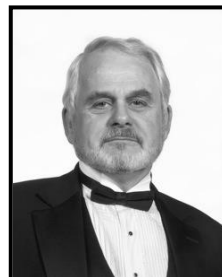

150 Years Of The Scottish Rite Masonry In Wisconsin

100 Years Of The Valley of Milwaukee (formerly the Valley of Wisconsin) In The Milwaukee Scottish Rite Center.



All five Wisconsin Valleys will come together in Milwaukee on Friday October 25 and Saturday October 26 to celebrate 200 years of Scottish Rite Masonry in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, the 150th Anniversary of the Valley of Milwaukee, once called the Valley of Wisconsin, and the 100th Anniversary of the Valley of Milwaukee being in the Humphrey Scottish Rite Center, above.

Each Valley will hold their own Reunion for the first weekend in their Valley and then travel to Milwaukee for the Wisconsin Council of Deliberation on Friday, October 25, 2013 and the Reunion culmination on Saturday, October 26, 2013. The Council of Deliberation will start at Noon with a Soup, Salad and Sandwich Lunch for \$10 per person. That afternoon will be the Council of Deliberation Session. ALL OFFICERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND. On Friday night there will be an authentic Wisconsin Fish Fry with entertainment for \$15 per person. Saturday will begin with a Bacon, Eggs, Potatoes and Pastries Breakfast from 7 am. until 9 am. for \$10 per person. The

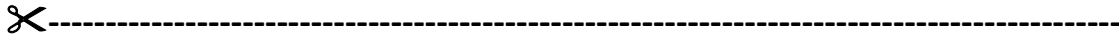

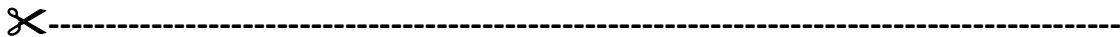
