CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION - VALLEY OF EAU CLAIRE

The early history of the Valley of Eau Claire was described by the Illustrious Robert M. Millard, 33°, PGM, and summarized in this article. Early on, this endeavor was one of much sacrifice, undaunted effort and selfless devotion on the part of a few in behalf of a great and noble cause.

By 1921, George B. Wheeler of Eau Claire was the only 33° Mason in Northern and Western Wisconsin. He had long cherished the hope that bodies of the Scottish Rite Masonry might be established here. However, there were some obstacles in his way. Brother Wheeler was approaching 70-years of age and was an extremely busy man as a prominent leader in business and civic life in the city. It was also known that the building (Temple at Main & Grand) would be inadequate in size to accommodate the organization. Besides this, there were only forty consistory members in Eau Claire, surely a rather small group to be laden with the responsibility of founding an institution whose members could number into the thousands. Furthermore, only Knight Templar were eligible to petition for the degrees at the time. This necessarily limited the field of operation to those cities in which Commanderies were located.

Brother Wheeler recognized the challenges and pressed forward. He invited all the 32-degree Masons in Eau Claire, Chippewa Falls, and Menomonie to dinner at the Temple on January 22, 1922 to discuss the advisability of the petitioning for a dispensation to form and open a Lodge of Perfection. At this gathering the proposal received the unanimous and enthusiastic approval of those present, 61 in number, all whom signed the petition.

The first working session was held May 8th, with 87initiates. The 4th and 14th degrees were conferred by the brethren of the Madison Lodge of Perfection. The initiation fees were \$50, and no dues were charged at the time. The following two sessions added 83 more members to the Lodge of Perfection, thus ensuring its unquestioned success. The sponsors petitioned for dispensation to form a Council, Princes of Jerusalem, and a Chapter of Rose Croix. These two bodies were instituted July 6, 1923, each with a charter membership of 34. Eight weeks later, on August 27th, they held their first working session, having 89 candidates, and fees of \$25 for each body. A number of prominent 33° Masons from Milwaukee assisted in the degree work. Enthusiasm ran high, less than a month after the Council and Chapter sessions, petitions were circulated for a Consistory dispensation.

During the ensuing 3 months, recruitment throughout Western and Northwest Wisconsin for 32-degree Masons to join in organizing the Consistory was conducted. By the end of December, a total of 230 had signed the petition. The Consistory was instituted January 3, 1924, and the first working session was held on May 5th and 6th of 1924, with 148 candidates who received the degrees from 19° through the 32°. The Scottish Rite venture had become so successful that the Consistory was able to contribute \$25,000 to the new Temple building fund by 1927, and in turn, was deeded a one-fourth undivided interest in the Masonic properties. The Eau Claire Temple of Free Masonry has been the headquarters of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite – Valley of Eau Claire

since its construction in 1927. Also in 1927, the Consistory joined those in Milwaukee and Madison in establishing annual dues of \$5.00 per member.

All went well until the Great Depression, when classes dropped as low as 14 members. To combat the situation, in 1933, fees for the degrees were reduced from \$150.00 to \$85.00 and the rule regarding eligibility for a petitioner was liberalized to require Blue Lodge membership only. Despite these concessions, members were still unable to pay their dues. The result was that by 1940 the Consistory owed the Board of Trustees of the Temple some \$20,000 in maintenance charges. With the coming of World War

2, however the situation changed rapidly, and a heavy influx of candidates became the rule. This enabled the Consistory to liquidate its debt and build up a substantial reserve.

In 1957, the Valley began publishing a monthly newsletter called "The Scottish Rite Reporter", which continues today on a quarterly distribution. Communication continues to be a very important means of success for our Valley. Many methods of communication are utilized to build our success. Which today includes: Web page, electronic version of the Reporter, Zoom meetings, and email communication.

The building has seen its challenges throughout the years. In 1961 the Auditorium was remodeled, and in 1963 a campaign held to remodel the Ballroom and the public address system within the building. A disastrous stage fire occurred at the Fall of 1968, and eventually cancelled the Reunion. This proved a blessing in disguise for we improved both the stage, auditorium, and organ.

Throughout the years of the Valley of Eau Claire's existence, we remain as enthusiastic as those founding Brothers who back in 1921 had a vision of spreading Brotherly Love. As our membership grew, over the years, men of the Valley of Eau Claire (Western, Central and Northern Wisconsin) have become better men for their families and communities with the help of the Valley.

Membership in 1949 was 1701, and at the Golden anniversary was 3151. Today we stand at 517 members. The years past is rich in memories of the great men who have helped to bring Scottish Rite to the Valley of Eau Claire and Masons of Northwestern Wisconsin. They opened ways for Masons to receive more light in Masonry.



DUES INCREASE FORTHCOMING

Earlier this year, the Officers of the Valley of Eau Claire identified that there was a need to increase membership dues to keep up with the cost associated with operating the Valley.
